Annual Pond Care Guide

SPRING: April – May

Once spring arrives and there is no ice left in your biological filter, skimmer or pipe, it's time to get your filtration system started. Drain your pond and perform a full pond clean-out with a pressure washer. If you choose to start up your pond without cleaning it, we recommend using Aquascape's new liquid **Pond & Debris Clarifier**. Pond & Debris Clarifier oxidizes and kills algae chemically, whether in the waterfall, stream or pond.

Reinstall your filter mats, BioBalls and skimmer components. Connect your pump to the plumbing; turn on the pump to check for leaks and proper flow rate. If the pump is working but there is no water flow, it may be that there is still ice in the pipe. Turn off the pump and try again in a few days.

Jump start your biological filter with Aquascape **Pond Starter Bacteria** when you open your pond or after a new pond construction. Pond Starter Bacteria, a concentrated blend of lithotrophic bacteria, speeds up the colonization of bacteria responsible for ammonia and nitrogen detoxification, thereby reducing spring fish loss. Treat your pond with Pond Starter Bacteria weekly for two weeks once your daytime temperature is at least 0°C/32°F.

Depending on your pond's water temperature, you may or may not need to use Aquascape **Cold Water Beneficial Bacteria** in the spring. If your daytime water temperature is at least 10°C/50°F, you may begin using Aquascape **Beneficial Bacteria for Ponds** right away. Cold Water Beneficial Bacteria should be used between 5°C/40°F and 10°C/50°F. Add the appropriate bacteria twice weekly for two weeks, followed by once per week thereafter. Don't forget to start using Aquascape **Premium Cold Water Fish Food Pellets** from 10°C/50°F.

Monitor the levels of ammonia, nitrite, nitrate and pH in your pond water with test strip kits. If any readings are in the 'danger zone', a partial water change is recommended. Don't forget to use Aquascape **Pond Detoxifier**.

Get your ionization system operating early so that copper levels have sufficient time to ramp up before the heat of the summer. Test your pond's copper levels weekly. Add Aquascape **Barley Straw Extract** during this ramp up phase (or all season for ponds without ionization systems) to discourage string algae growth.

Unseasonably warm spring weather can encourage abrupt nitrifying bacterial activity that can rapidly deplete dissolved oxygen levels in the pond, so it's important to begin circulating your pond as soon as possible. Have a pond aerator on hand to promote proper gas exchange.

FALL: September – October

Make fall pond maintenance simple and efficient. Prevent pond conditions from deteriorating to the point where aggressive measures are necessary.

Install pond netting to prevent leaves and debris from accumulating at the bottom of the pond. Remove organic materials from the surface of your pond using a skimmer net.

Condition your pond with Aquascape **Cold Water Beneficial Bacteria**, beginning with daytime water temperatures below 10°C/50°F. Treat twice weekly for two weeks, then once per week until the water begins to freeze. Cold Water Beneficial Bacteria is now rated for use in water temperatures as low as 2°C/35°F.

Remove or bring tropical (non-hardy) plants indoors. Trim hardy lilies down to about an inch or two above the crown and move them to a deeper part of the pond.

Trim marginal or bog plants. Remove water lettuce and water hyacinths when they are looking poorly. You may leave some tall marginals for winter interest.

When the first film of ice forms on your pond, it's time to think about dismantling your filtration system, as well as draining and removing your pump. Remove all filter mats, BioBalls and skimmer components; rinse and dry thoroughly and store in your garage or basement for the winter.

Tsurumi pumps require an annual oil & seal change. Consult your manufacturer's recommendations to determine the proper method to store your pump.

Fall is the most important time of year to feed your fish. And you only have a 6°C/11°F window of opportunity to do so! Make sure you have a floating pond thermometer and consult it often!

Switch back to Aquascape **Premium Cold Water Fish Food Pellets** once the daytime water temperature drops to 15°C/60°F and continue to feed your fish at 10°C/50°F. However, once the water temperature is consistently below 10°C/50°F, stop feeding your fish altogether.

Your fish will be dormant for up to six months and will have to survive on accumulated fat storage to sustain themselves until spring.

Early spring is the best time to re-pot pond plants. Add Aquascape **Pond Plant Fertilizer** tablets to water lilies to encourage blooms (and every long weekend including Labour Day). This is also the ideal time to add new plants.

SUMMER: June – August

If you keep fish, it is particularly important that you treat your pond with **Pond Starter Bacteria** first, before adding beneficial bacteria, regardless of the time of year. Pond Starter Bacteria supports the pond's nitrogen cycle until such time as your pond's plants are ready to begin absorbing nitrate, or plant fertilizer—which is the end product of the conversion of ammonia by the heterotrophic bacteria—found in Beneficial Bacteria for Ponds or Cold Water Beneficial Bacteria.

Keep in mind that increased sunlight, a higher nutrient load and rising water temperature create ideal conditions for aggressive algae growth. Aquascape **Barley Straw Extract** discourages but does not eliminate algae growth; consider installing **The Iongen System** by Aquascape.

Aquascape **EcoBlast** continues to be the fastest way to eliminate debris, including algae, on contact. If you regularly use EcoBlast or **Pond & Debris Clarifier**, we recommend using Aquascape **Sludge & Filter Cleaner**, which will specifically target and metabolize the decaying matter accumulating in the bottom of your pond, once the daytime water temperature reaches 15°C/60°F.

To maintain your 'new pond' water quality, we recommend applying Aquascape **SAB Stream & Pond Cleaner** (mixed in warm water, 26°C/80°F) to your pond on a bi-weekly basis. This popular product is a powerful phosphate binder and acts to reduce algae and ammonia, derived from excess nutrients in the pond, whether from rainwater runoff, plant material decomposition or the waste from too many fish.

Make sure you have sufficient plants in your pond. We recommend one marginal plant for every two feet of shoreline; one submerged oxygenator bunch for every five square feet; 25% surface coverage for lilies, and 25% surface coverage for floating oxygenators. Use water lettuce and water hyacinths as natural algae control as they are superb at absorbing nutrients as well as providing shade, keeping the water cooler.

Switch to Aquascape **Premium Colour Enhancing Fish Food Pellets**, a growth fish food, once daytime water temperatures remain above 15°C/60°F. Feed your fish just enough food that they can consume within three to five minutes, then remove any uneaten food. Restrict feeding to once daily.

This is the ideal time to add new fish to your pond. Follow The Pond Clinic's acclimation guidelines. Don't overcrowd your pond—follow the golden rule of a maximum of one inch of fish per square foot of surface area.

WINTER: November – March

Harmful gases trapped under the ice can accumulate to create toxic conditions for fish. Maintain an opening in the ice for proper gas exchange with a pond aerator and/or a pond de-icer, and make sure it always stays open.

We recommend that you set up your aerator and de-icer before the ice forms. If you do need to create a hole in the ice, we recommend using hot water or an auger, never an axe.

We recommend using both a de-icer and an aerator to maintain a hole in the ice. It is actually best practice to use both winter devices for redundancy. Place the de-icer over or next to the hole generated by the aerator, for optimal results.

Aquascape's **300W Pond De-icer** has a built-in thermostat which will draw current only as required. The Aquascape **Pond Aerator Pro** uses only 45 Watts of electrical power. Place the aerator's air stone approximately 12 inches below the water line to achieve the best bubbling action at the surface, and prevent ice formation.

Keep the aerator's compressor pump sheltered from too much snow and ice buildup by placing in under a deck or simply by covering it with a board and brick.

Prevent snow from piling too high on the frozen pond surface so you can safely find and maintain your de-icing equipment. Build a berm with snow or burlap bags to create a wind barrier for your de-icer, so that its heat is not dissipated by the wind.

For Snowbirds, it is very important to have a neighbour check on your pond regularly to ensure that the air hole is maintained all winter long.
